The Impact of Retained Surgical Sharps and Near Misses on Patient Safety

Retained surgical items continue to be in the top three reported sentinel events, according to the Joint Commission. However, reporting sentinel events to an

accrediting organization such as The Joint Commission is voluntary. In fact, Joint Commission reported that less than an estimated 2% of all sentinel events have been reported. A "near-miss" is an unplanned event that does not result in patient injury; thus, reporting is rare. A nationwide survey with surgeons, surgical nurses/ technicians, and anesthesiologists took place in 2020 to understand the frequency and impacts of retained surgical sharps and near-miss "sharps" (NMS). Perioperative staff must know the real data on retained surgical sharps to develop the appropriate patient safety protocol to reduce retained surgical sharps events and minimize the time and resources required for searching.
